## **Feasibility Study**

The results are not surprising, and confirms my most pessimistic perspective. We have a challenge ahead of us and much work to do! Basically, the expectation is we can raise \$1.4M from local individuals/businesses. I think it is important to continue moving forward to a campaign to raise awareness of what needs to be funded and the benefits for the community. I do think going to the ballot in a few years is realistic. I will be talking with the City Administrator & Planning in the next couple of weeks to consider some grant strategies. The Baron site design development through the EPA funds is very exciting. These funds are for development of a site plan with elevations. To take that plan to the next steps will be another partnership with the City, Main St and Planning.

## Staff




## Programs/Events
