# **Director's Report**

## Land Acknowledgement

I am making a little progress. I'll be talking this week with Karl Habeck, General Manager of WOJB and a member of the LCO Nation as well as a former librarian.

# **Building & Architects**

Alex is still pulling some information together to get the professional cost estimates together. We will probably have another meeting in late March. Pastor Detters and I are working on a meeting time/day and gathering a small group to focus on the Baron Lot. It would be great to have one board member attend. Let me know if you are interested.

#### Staff

All things considered, I would like to hire an additional page. The hours will be limited to 7-10/week. There are funds (\$24,000) we are carrying over from 2021 to add to our current budget that can be used to cover this. I will ask for a motion at the meeting. In total, the expense to add a page is not more than \$5000 annually and provides benefits for both the library and the Page (usually a first job).

#### **Programs**

The February programs were lightly attended, but those who participated really enjoyed the events. Liisa Eyerly, local author, will have a book talk with coffee/rolls sponsored by the Friends of the Library on March 26, 10:30 - 12:00; reading at 11 am.

#### Policy - COVID 19 Masking

The City of Ashland has lifted the mandatory masking policy for city buildings. The <u>CDC</u> is removing any language that uses mandatory or required and leaves the decisions up to individuals and organizations. Here's the updated language on the library <u>website</u>. We rescinded the VPL <u>Pandemic Policy</u> in June, 2021 with a few exceptions. Reading through it, those are all still applicable, so I do not think we need to take any policy action.
